Context of the School

St John's Angell Town CE Primary is an average sized primary school. The vast majority of pupils reside on the Angell Town estate. Angell Town has a strong community spirit that is rich and vibrant, despite high levels of relative deprivation. The vast majority of pupils have West African heritage (60%). Black Caribbean make up the second largest group with 22% of pupils identified as having this heritage. In recent years the school has become more diverse with increasing number of pupils with Iberian and Latin American backgrounds.

A significantly high number of pupils are in receipt of Pupil Premium (48%). The percentage of pupils with statements or EHC plans is 4%. A further 12% receive SEN intervention.

A significant proportion of our pupils have English as an additional language (65%). Approximately 65% of pupils have west African heritage , 25% Afro-Caribbean and increasing number of Spanish and Portuguese speaking groups.

Objectives of Sports Premium Spending

- To ensure that all children have access to high quality PE lessons
- Ensure that children experience a broad range of PE and sports activities
- To promote healthy lifestyles
- To compete within in school and out of school competitions
- Take part in enrichment activities for broaden experiences
- To develop existing staff competencies to deliver good quality PE lessons
