



**INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT:**

**ST JOHN'S ANGELL TOWN  
CHURCH OF ENGLAND  
PRIMARY SCHOOL**

***LAMBETH***  
**EDUCATION**

1. The name of the school is St John's Angell Town Church of England Primary School.
2. The school is a voluntary aided school.
3. The name of the governing body is St John's Angell Town Church of England Primary School Governing Body.
4. The governing body shall consist of:
  - (a) eight foundation governors
  - (b) two parent governor
  - (c) one LEA governor
  - (d) one staff governor
  - (e) the head teacher (except at any time when he has given written notice to the clerk of the governing body of the school that he chooses not to be a governor);
5. Total number of governors is 12, (except at any time when the head teacher has given notice as above that he chooses not to be a governor, when the total number of governors will be 10).
6. The foundation governors in 4(a) above shall comprise:
  - (a) two appointed by the Southwark Diocesan Board of Education
  - (b) four appointed by the Parochial Church Council of St John, Angell Town, at least two of whom shall be parents of registered pupils at the school.
7. The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio:
  - (a) The principal officiating minister of the ecclesiastical parish of St John, Angell Town.
  - (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated shall appoint a foundation governor to act in place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above in the event that the ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which his/her governorship exists.

The foundation governors must be in a majority of TWO and the number of foundation governors will have to be adjusted where the Headteacher decides not to be a governor.

In the event there being a surplus of foundation governors, voluntary resignations will be sought from among the PCC appointees (not including those who are appointed as foundation parents in accordance with paragraph 6 (b)). If there are insufficient resignations, written notice of termination of the appointment will be given to those who have served the shortest period, or in the event of equal seniority, the selection would be made by the drawing of lots.

#### 8. Ethos Statement


Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all pupils.

9. Subject to regulation 5(4) of the Education (School Government) (Transition to New Framework) Regulations 1998, this instrument of government comes into effect:

- on the date of making for the purpose of reconstituting the governing body;
- on 1 September 1999 for all other purposes.
