RECORD BREAKERS



Last term the children produced some excellent homework! This half term's homework theme will be 'record breakers.' Choose from the selection of activities suggested below. The aim is to complete at least one task per week (you can do more if you wish.) Below is a mixture of practical and recorded tasks from which to choose. The aim is to be as creative as possible. **These are just a few ideas. You could think of your own activities to do.** Please remember to still complete core learning tasks which are on-going (spelling/reading/ maths.)

You have this half term to complete your project. The deadline date for handing everything in will be:

Monday 10th July.

Certificates and prizes will be awarded in assembly for the best homework projects.

Menu of Activities:

Find out about the biggest dinosaur that ever lived. What was it called? What did it look like? How big was it? Do the same with the smallest.

The world record for the most skipping rope jumps is 93 jumps in 30 seconds. How many can you do? Can you set your own record?

Who has the most Olympic gold medals in the world? Find out and tell me about them!

Find out about the tallest building in the world. Create a model of it!

What is the slowest animal in the world? Create a fact-file about them. What is the fastest animal?

We have been on a trip to the aquarium. Paint me a picture of the biggest animal you saw. What can you find out about it? What is the biggest animal in the sea? Do the same for the smallest.

Find out about your own world record. Can you find a silly world record that will make us laugh?

Spelling and Writing:

Continue to practise spellings sent home each week.

Continue to practise pre-cursive handwriting at home. This should be done using the handwriting sheets sent home each week.

Please return these every Monday.

Ask your child each day which sound they learnt in phonics that day. Can they give you a word using that sound?

Practise writing sentences at home, using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

Practise spelling all numbers up to 20.

Maths:

The children have been practising their mental maths. Please encourage this by giving them addition and subtraction questions up to 20.

Practise forming numbers correctly, making sure they are neat and the correct way round.

Practise reciting the order of the days of the week and the months of the year.

This term children will be learning that division means sharing. Practise sharing out objects.

Reading:

Every child should be reading for **at least 5 minutes every day**. Please read a variety of texts- story books, information books, magazines etc.

The children have a reading buddy called Fred the Frog. If the children are stuck on a word encourage them to use Fred and to look for the special friends in words.

Children's school reading books are changed every Friday. Please bring them back to school by Thursday.
